SCHOOL NEWS (K-12th GRADES)

January Builder Theme: I am a builder when I work diligently

I read a fascinating book a few years ago called *Outliers*, in which author Malcolm Gladwell studied the lives of tremendously successful groups or individuals to find out how they attained success. As a result, he claims that it takes around ten thousand hours of practice to achieve mastery in a field. How does Gladwell arrive at this conclusion? As one example, in the early 1990s, a team of psychologists in Berlin, Germany studied the practice habits of violin students in childhood, adolescence, and adulthood. All were asked, "Over the course of your entire career, ever since you first picked up the violin, how many hours have you practiced?" All of the violinists began playing at roughly five years of age with similar practice times. However, at age eight, practice times began to diverge. By age twenty, the elite performers averaged more than 10,000 hours of practice each, while the less able performers had only 4,000 hours of practice. The elite had more than double the practice hours of the less capable performers. *They were more diligent.* The diligent software developer writes code at work, and as well as writing software on her own time. The diligent athlete practices on the field with his teammates, then goes home to watch game films. The diligent physician listens to medical podcasts in the car during the car ride home. We can all become great at something by being diligent. Think about what you like to do and how you would like to become even better at it; then work diligently to achieve it!

Varsity Boys Basketball

APA's High School Boys' basketball team defeated previously unbeaten Doral Red Rock 30-20 in NCSSL play on Saturday, January 13. The victory snapped a three-game road losing streak which included two losses at NCSSL leader SLAM JV team and one loss at NIAA Calvary Chapel Christian School. With the win the Eagles are now 2-4 overall and 2-2 in league play.

The first half was tightly contested, and behind senior guard Brody McLeod's hot shooting (4-4 from the floor, 9 points) the Eagles led 16-15 at halftime. Dominant rebounding and solid defense allowed APA to pull away in the second half. The Eagles pulled down 25 rebounds - 11 offensive - in the second half. APA's defense stymied Red Rock in the second half, holding Doral to only 5 points. Senior forward Anthony Harley pulled down 12 rebounds (5 offensive) to lead the team. McLeod led all scorers with 15 points and also contributed 6 rebounds (3 offensive). The Eagles host Founders' Academy this Tuesday (January 16, tip off approximately 6:00 p.m.) and face off against American Heritage Academy at SLAM in NCSSL play on Saturday (January 20, tip off at 9:00 a.m.).
